Nut and Scent Aware

⇒ Due to health concerns associated with exposure to nuts and scents, we discourage all nuts and nut products and the use of scented products in the Centre.

Food & Beverages

- ⇒ Infant feeding is permitted anywhere in the centre.
- ⇒ Eat and drink provided beverages and food only in the designated areas.

Tidying Up

⇒ We ask that you treat the toys/materials in the Centre with respect; please help your child tidy up when finished using toys/material before moving onto something new.

Diapering

⇒ Please use the designated diaper change area in the washroom; follow posted instructions.

Parking & Transportation

- ⇒ Parking is available to the west of the building.
- ⇒ If you have barriers getting to and from the Centre, please talk to a staff member to discuss options.

Guidelines for Parents and Caregivers



Program Times & Registration

- ⇒ Program times vary and change in response to the needs of families; please check with staff for the most recent program schedules.
- ⇒ Please sign up for pre-registered programs; talk to staff for details.

Belongings

- ⇒ Parents and/or caregivers are responsible for their personal belongings; to maintain a safe play environment, please keep all outerwear, diaper bags, knapsacks, grocery bags, strollers, car seats, etc. in the designated area.
- ⇒ The Centre is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged belongings.

Electronic Devices

⇒ Please do not use your cell phone or other devices while you are visiting the Centre unless necessary. The Centre is a place where the focus is on interaction with the children and one another.

Personal Conduct

- ⇒ Please use the designated diaper change area in the washroom; follow posted instructions
- ⇒ Please keep conversations and parenting practices child-based: be mindful of the language you use and be non-punitive.

Visiting the Centre

First Visit:

⇒ Parents and/or adult caregivers are asked to sign in and review the following guidelines and complete a family information form.

Every Visit:

- ⇒ Parents and/or adult caregivers are asked to sign in each time they arrive to visit to the Centre.
- ⇒ To help avoid the spread of germs, please practice, and assist your children with frequent handwashing. Follow procedures posted near the handwashing and bathroom sinks.
- ⇒ Before playing, please wash hands and/or sanitize your hands as well as your child's.
- ⇒ Socks or indoor shoes must be worn.
- ⇒ Children are to be supervised by their parent/caregiver at all times; children are never to be left alone; you are responsible for your own children while you are at the Centre; if you need to step away, please ask another parent/caregiver to mind your child.
- ⇒ Children and parents and/or caregivers who are ill should not attend the Centre; program staff may ask families to leave the Centre if a child or parent/caregiver are ill at the Centre.

Smoking/Vaping/Tobacco

- ⇒ It is prohibited indoors and within 3 metres (10 feet) of windows and air-intake of the Centre; do not smoke/vape in front of the building; if you have been smoking/vaping you are asked to immediately wash or sanitize your hands upon entering the Centre.
- ⇒ The Centre recognizes and respects that the use of tobacco or tobacco-related products is an integral part of traditional Indigenous spiritual, cultural practices and ceremonies. Ceremonial use can be carried out in the Centre.

Alcohol & Drugs

⇒ It is prohibited for anyone to be at the Centre that is under the influence of, intoxicated by, or hungover due to drugs, including certain prescribed medications, marijuana, alcohol or any controlled substance.

Immunization

⇒ It is recommended that children and adults are up to date with their immunization according to the Saskatchewan Health Immunization Schedule; please speak with program staff to learn more and how to get up to date.

Emergency Response

⇒ Posted in the receiving area
